**PASTOR'S MESSAGE****TELL THE NEXT GENERATION**

We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the LORD, about his power and his mighty wonders.

Psalm 78 focuses mainly on the sad history of Israel's persistent rebellion against the Lord but the hope is that the future for Israel might be better than the past if those who are mature teach the next generation to know and serve the Lord. Then the next generation will "set its hope anew on God" (78:7).

This psalm as a theme for our Jubilee celebrations reminds those of us who are growing in our Christian faith that we have the responsibility of passing on our faith to the next generation. The reality is that this is not happening effectively, that increasing numbers of people under 30 are rejecting the faith. This is a universal phenomenon of a general decline and secularization which pains parents whose children turn away from the Church. Yet we also see that the gospel values of peace, joy and justice are lived and are kept in high esteem by our young people which gives us hope.

**QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION**

We need to speak aloud the story of God's wonders and share the good news in a way that communicates with the next generation?

Have we set our life as role model of faith, hope and love?

**PRAYER:**

Jesus my Good Shepherd, today I'm reminded of my responsibility to share your wonders with the next generation. I pray today along with my parish, we may take a joined responsibility in finding creative and effective ways to share the good news with younger folk. Help us to make this a priority, to stretch ourselves for the sake of the next generation. Help me, to be faithful in this endeavor in my own life. With my children and their friends, may I share my faith in word and deed, doing so in a way that is authentic and open. May I live my faith in such a way that the younger people in my world see your reality in me, so they might be open to hear me speak of your grace. Amen.

**First Nations & The Vatican**

**"IN 2009, THE NATIONAL CHIEF OF THE ASSEMBLY OF FIRST NATIONS**, Phil Fontaine, along with other representatives, had a moving encounter with Pope Benedict XVI at the Vatican. Chief Fontaine told the media he hoped the expression of regret would 'close the book' on the issue of apologies for residential school survivors. Another attendee at the meeting with Pope Benedict, Edward John, Grand Chief of the First Nations Summit in British Columbia, said the Pope acknowledged the suffering of those who are still living with the consequences of their experiences at the schools. In comments to the media, he said, 'I think in that sense, there was that apology that we were certainly looking for.'" In the current Parliamentary debate it is important to remember that "the Vatican and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops were never involved in running the former schools, and that those 'Roman Catholic Entities' named as parties in the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement were legally deemed to have fulfilled the requirements of the settlement agreement by a judicial review. Following this review, the former Conservative government released the entities from further obligations – a decision the present Liberal government did not appeal." ([CCCB](http://www.cccb.ca)).

- Sing the hymns, pray, and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by your example.
- If you need to leave Mass with your child please feel free - but come back when they have calmed down.
- Encourage your child to attend Children's Liturgy, if they are not comfortable, go with them for a week or two.
- Remember the goal: children who are welcome at mass know they are welcomed by God and by the Church!
